Located in the Adult Library, the center is equipped with multiple PCs and laptops, two Macs, a 24-inch wide printer, two 3D printers, scanner and more. The computers feature Microsoft and Adobe applications, among others.

The center will host classes (see Page 3) where patrons can learn new skills as well as get demos

of the library's digital resources and services.
