

Trustee Vote to be June 9

South Huntington voters will select two library trustees using the same ballot on which they will vote on the South Huntington School District budget and elect school board members. The vote will be held exclusively by mail-in ballot with return postage paid; no in-person votes will be cast.

An executive order issued by New York State Governor Andrew Cuomo is changing the way library and school district voting will be conducted this year, including setting the June 9 date. The library board of trustees had already opted to cancel the library's April 7 budget vote and to have the library operate next year on the same budget as during its current fiscal year. However, there was still the matter of the trustee election.

The executive order gave libraries the option of partnering

with their school districts for voting on June 9 or holding a separate library trustee election on Sept. 15. The library worked with the school district to share the June 9 ballot and consolidate management of the vote.

Two incumbent library trustees are running unopposed for re-election. Stella Fox is seeking an additional five-year term, and Eleanora Ferrante is running for one year to finish the term to which she was appointed last year, when Kate Rea resigned and relocated out of state. Both trustee candidates fulfilled the necessary requirements to appear on the ballot in preparation for the original April 7 vote date, keeping them eligible for the June ballot.

Registered voters in the South Huntington School District can expect to receive a ballot in the mail with a return postage-paid envelope.

El voto del fideicomisario de la biblioteca será el 9 de junio

Los votantes de South Huntington seleccionarán dos fideicomisarios de la biblioteca usando la misma boleta en la que votarán por el presupuesto del Distrito Escolar de South Huntington y elegir a los miembros del consejo escolar. La votación se llevará a cabo exclusivamente por correo con estampilla pagada; no se emitirán votos en persona.

Una orden ejecutiva emitida por el Gobernador del Estado de Nueva York Andrew Cuomo está cambiando la forma en que la biblioteca y distrito escolar realizarán la votación este año, incluyendo la fijación de la fecha del 9 de junio. La junta directiva de la biblioteca ya habían optado por cancelar la votación del presupuesto del 7 de abril y hacer que la biblioteca funcione el próximo año con el mismo presupuesto que durante el año fiscal en curso. Sin embargo, todavía estaba el asunto de la elección del fideicomisario.

La orden ejecutiva dio a las bibliotecas la opción de asociarse con sus


distritos escolares para votar el 9 de junio o que se realice una elección de fideicomisarios de la biblioteca el 15 de septiembre. La biblioteca trabajó con el distrito escolar para compartir la boleta del 9 de junio y consolidar la gestión de la votación.

Dos miembros del consejo de administración de la biblioteca se presentan sin oposición a la reelección. Stella Fox está buscando un cargo adicional de cinco años, y Eleanora Ferrante se postula por un año para terminar el período en el que estaba nombrado el año pasado, cuando Kate Rea renunció y se trasladó fuera del estado. Ambas candidatas a fideicomisarias cumplieron los requisitos necesarios para aparecer en la boleta en preparación para la fecha original de votación del 7 de abril, manteniéndolas elegibles para la votación de junio.

Los votantes registrados en el Distrito Escolar de South Huntington recibirán una boleta por correo con un sobre de devolución con estampilla.


Local Yearbooks Now Online

Two New Digital Resources for News

The New York Times

South Huntington Library cardholders can get unlimited and free access to NYTimes.com and NYT phone and tablet apps for 3 days by clicking a code redemption link, which can be found on our website at www.shpl.info.

Once you have created your account (or have logged in), you will receive an email confirmation of your 72-hour, unlimited access to New York Times Digital. Once the 72 hours has expired, you will need to activate a new code for another 72 hours, and so on.

When the library reopens, patrons will be able to access The New York Times Digital from public computers and personal devices connected to the library's wi-fi, though you will have to log in or create a NYT account.

PressReader

A digital newsstand with thousands of the world's most popular newspapers and magazines. With publications from over 120 countries in more than 60 different languages, you have instant access to all of this content, including digital editions of the New York Daily News and the New York Post.

Read the publications in a browser at www.pressreader.com or download the app for iOS, Android, and Windows to read on a portable device. Click sign in and select "Library and Group", search for South Huntington Public Library, and enter your SHPL barcode. You have the option to create a PressReader account, but it is not required. With an account you will be granted 30 days complimentary access to PressReader.


Learn Something New!


Aristotle and Dante Discover the Secrets of the Universe by Benjamin Alire Sáenz Hey peeps, Miss Georgina
