

Media Ethics

Tues., Oct. 6 at 3 p.m.

In this session, we will consider the ethical issues journalists face as they strive to be accurate, fair and clear. Utilizing real-life case studies, we will examine the issues journalists may encounter, including privacy, anonymous sources and the pressure to be first.

Fighting Fake News Tues., Oct. 13 at 3 p.m.

We will explore the problem of fake news in today's media landscape. What qualifies as "fake" news? Why should you care what's real and what's not? How can the motivation behind news stories shape the content?

Bias Meter

Tues., Oct. 20 at 3 p.m.

In this session we will take a step back from media negativity to look at the posi-

tive: What are the qualities of fair news coverage? Learn how to assess word choice, use of context and counterpoints to make informed, impartial evaluations of news in print, online and on social media sources.

Propaganda

Tues., Oct. 27 at 3 p.m.

We will look at the methods propaganda uses to worm its way into our brains by exploring four universal techniques for manipulating human emotions. We will also explore practical strategies to combat propaganda and improve the quality of our information ecosystem.

Consumer health information provided by the National Library of Medicine. Use this database to research more than 1,000 diseases and conditions, learn about the latest treatments, look up information on drugs and supplements, and view medical videos. There is a separate Spanish language database.

NY Physician Profile

Look up information on your doctors' education, practice information, specialties and legal actions.

To access: Go to our website at www.shpl.info>Research>View All Databases. Filter results for Health and Medicine. You will need a South Huntington Library card.



Once you have created your account (or logged in), you will receive an email confirmation of your 72-hour access to New York Times Digital. Once the time has expired, you will need to activate a new code for another 72 hours, and so on.

Patrons can also access The New York Times Digital from public computers and personal devices connected to the library's wi-fi, though you will have to log in or create a New York Times account.

PressReader

With publications from over 120 countries in more than 60 different lan-

guages, you have instant access to all of this content, including digital editions of the New York Daily News and the New York

Post.

Read the publications in a browser at www.pressreader.com or download the app for iOS, Android, and Windows to read on a device. Click sign in and select "Library and Group," search for South Huntington Library, and enter your SHPL barcode.



Did you know that the South Huntington Public Library has a Print Budii, where you can print photos from your smart phone? To get started: Go to the Print Budii website at https://libraries.printbudii.com/pwa/. Choose the South Huntington Library location, upload the photos you wish to print

and pay with your credit card. You will receive a code that you enter at our Print Budii kiosk, located in Adult Services on the main level, to print out your 4x6 photos. Photos are 35 cents each and there is a minimum of 2 photos per order.
