

https://libraries.printbudii.com/pwa. Choose the South Huntington Library location, upload the photos you wish to print and pay with a credit card. You will receive a code to enter into the Print Budii kiosk, located in Adult Services, to retrieve your 4x6 photos. Photos are 35 cents and there is a minimum of two photos per order.

Astronomy Lecture: A Sunrise Scimitar Mon., June 7 at 3 p.m.

Early risers in the Northeast U.S. on Thursday morning, June 10th, will – weather conditions permitting – be treated to the most unusual sunrise of their lives, for they will not see a yellow-orange circle of light, but a large solar eclipse that will transform the Sun into a fiery scimitar!



Such a circumstance is very rare, having occurred only twice in the past 150 years. Eclipses of the Sun and Moon are dramatic natural events which have been described in records going back for centuries in many civilizations. Join meteorologist Joe Rao live on Zoom to examine the mechanics of what causes eclipses as well as look at events coming our way in the future, including the total solar eclipse that will be visible from upstate New York and New England on April 8, 2024. 



Embracing Color: Paintings by Stan Brodsky, Ellen Hallie Schiff & Ty Stroudsburg. June 19-September 7.

This group exhibit is sure to awaken all your senses! These artists experience and record the depths and nuances of color. This exhibit demonstrates how painting can retain an urgency for artists who want to see anew.

In 2019, the art world lost Stan

Brodsky, an abstract expressionist painter and extraordinary teacher, at age 94. He was also a former curator of the library's art gallery. His expressive paintings are rich with intense color that evoke and resonate memories and emotions. His paintings can be found in many museums and prestigious collections.

Ellen Hallie Schiff is energized by color and the sense of discovery of how colors meet and

interact. Whether making skinny scraping marks with the tip of the palette knife or sensuous thick pigment-filled marks, she loves using her whole arm, conveying emotion through physicality as part of her process.

Grounded in the physical landscape, artist Ty Stroudsburg moves back and forth from abstraction to representational, then combines both elements to create her own language. She may drive around looking for inspiration, pulling color from scenes, noting the colors and forms that will find their way into her paintings.






