



All families with children 12 and under are invited to participate in our new "SHPL Family Fun" program.




As per state guidelines, fully vaccinated individuals are not required to wear a face covering in the building. The Library is not checking patrons' vaccination status.



WWII & NYC: The Big Apple Goes to War

Tues., July 20 at 3 p.m.



New Yorkers did not suffer the devastation experienced by citizens of London, Moscow, Berlin, or Tokyo during World War II. But New York City was a

center of activity and contributed disproportionately to the final victory. New York produced everything from battleships to brassieres and periscopes to penicillin, and more than three million troops and over 63 million tons of supplies passed through New York Harbor en route to the battlefield. In this interactive virtual presentation, hear littleknown stories such as how a group of German saboteurs landed on Long Island only to take the LIRR in the wrong direction, and why a portion of the FDR Drive is built atop rubble from Bristol, England. Presented by The New-York Historical Society. Register for Zoom link beginning July 6.

LI Migrant Labor Camps: Dust for Blood

Tues., July 20 at 7 p.m.

During World War II, a group of potato farmers opened the first migrant labor camp in Suffolk

County to house farmworkers from Jamaica. Over the next twenty years, more than one hundred camps of various sizes would be built throughout the region. Thousands of migrant workers lured by promises of good wages and decent housing flocked to Eastern Long Island, where they were often cheated out of pay and housed in deadly slum-like conditions. Preyed on by corrupt camp operators and entrapped in a feudal system that left them mired in debt, laborers struggled and, in some cases, perished in the shadow of New York's affluence. Join author Mark A. Torres in this virtual discussion of his book as he reveals the dreadful history of Long Island's migrant labor camps from their inception to their peak in 1960 and their steady decline in the following decades.
