Temping Fate by Esther Friesner

After being turned down for every summer job she applies for, Ilana is desperate. So when she finds a card for the "Divine Relief Temp Agency," in her sister's drawer, she jumps at the chance to apply. After a strange interview process, Ilana finds herself temping for the fates, the Greek Goddesses who cut and measure everyone's life spans. As strange as the job is, Ilana's new friends and her need to escape her sister's wedding plans are enough reason for her to stick around. When one of her fellow temps tries to sabotage her sister's wedding and bring chaos to the world, it's up to Ilana, her friends, and an entire cast of mythological characters to save the day. This book is a great read. It has an original and exciting plot. There were twists everywhere and the appearances by the deities were often hysterical.
