

## Calling All Local Authors

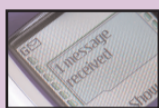

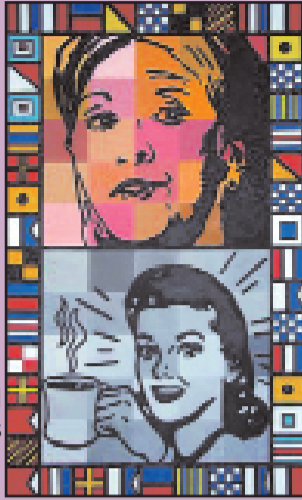
### 'MEMORIES/FULFILLED,' by Bruce Laird

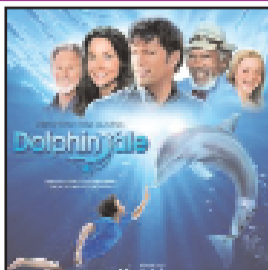
